The NSWAS Primary School is the first school in Israel to institute a bilingual, binational curriculum for children aged kindergarten through sixth grade. Students learn together in Hebrew and Arabic, and 90 percent of enrollees travel more than 20 miles each day to attend.

I was nervous to go to school at first, but when someone new comes, immediately everyone hugs them and treats them like family. My favorite thing so far is that we all get to learn each other's languages. I knew a little bit of Arabic before, but this was like opening a door. It's helped me make new friends in my class and in younger grades.

There are so many activities you can do in the fifth grade! I'm part of a theater group that is writing a play about what we've learned and done this year. It will be in two languages. I'm learning how to use a computer and make computer games, and I'm also learning how to felt in an art class. Trying so many new things has made me a lot more open to everyone and to new experiences. I also have a younger brother. He is in the first grade, and he is really having fun here, too!

We are thankful for the dedicated teachers, staff, and school for educating our children with the value that Palestinian and Jewish children deserve to learn and grow together.”

I started at this school as a toddler, when I was in the kindergarten, and I have three sisters who graduated from the Primary School. I'm the youngest.

The things I enjoy learning the best are language and science. I love biology and studying animals—and I already know how to speak Hebrew, Arabic, English, a little Spanish, and a little bit of Russian. It's easier to learn English than Hebrew. But Hebrew is the second easiest language to learn!

I know that my school is the place with the most peace because we always take care of each other.
