This time they have enlisted friends and family to sign their request that the Primary School be expanded to include middle school and high school. ### OASIS OF PEACE WELCOMES 10 NEW FAMILIES



# SCHOOL FOR PEACE GRADUATES ORGANIZE

Organizing is the starting line for real social change. But how do you get two people who live at odds to join forces for justice? Just ask a School for Peace graduate! The SFP trains participants to connect and network across cultures and issues to advance equality. Graduates from our Urban Planners and Architects course have found strength in the binational, professional community they have created and they will no longer be silent in the face of injustice. Today, that injustice is the destruction of Palestinian villages.

In an open letter to PM Netanyahu, Jewish and Palestinian SFP graduates of the planners and architects course are calling for an end to the demolitions, and for an immediate advancement of fair planning policies to meet the needs of the growing Palestinian population. Standing in solidarity with Palestinian families in their endangered villages, raising their voices on the streets of Tel Aviv and Kalanswa with thousands of protesters and working with local municipalities to adopt fair planning and permit practices, the SFP graduates can be found on the front lines of the fight for justice and equality. "We are, of course, an integral part of this land, yet in this country we live on the margins ...You can't just complain all the time about the reality without trying to do something about it; we have to go out there and try to change the reality, our reality."-Palestinian participant

# J. ZEL LURIE 1913-2017 A LEGACY OF PEACE



On April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017, the American Friends of Neve Shalom/Wahat al-Salam said goodbye to our dear friend, J. Zel Lurie. Throughout his lifetime, **Zel was dedicated to making a difference in the lives of Palestinians and Jews.** As a journalist and co-founder of American Friends of Neve Shalom/Wahat al-Salam, he tirelessly promoted peace through his words and actions. At 103 years of age, Zel left behind an inspiring legacy as well as a hole in our hearts.

Forty years ago, Zel came to Neve Shalom/Wahat al-Salam for the first time. He immediately saw what was possible if the focus was on both peoples together finding ways- especially in the midst of surrounding conflict - to live and work with one another in equality and

mutual respect.

From the moment Zel saw the Primary School, **he understood** 

that integrated education as early as possible was going to be key to finding the way forward. When Zel found himself able to offer financial support, he focused on a new school building that could grow along with the expanding Primary School applications.

"In the next ten years, I want to see the Primary School grow, able to bring in more children. I want it to continue to be a model for how Jews and Arabs can live and learn and grow together. "



Zel's hopes became a reality. However, he knew welcoming increasing numbers of hopeful



applicants meant that there must be increasing financial support. Zel made a commitment to fund a teacher's salary every year as his way of supporting the kind of future that he wanted for his own family. He wanted to support a future filled with justice, equality and respect for one another.

For all these years, we have been standing on his shoulders, taking encouragement and guidance. Now it is our turn and yours to become the shoulders for the next generation.
